Review**

The first phase of the Harbour Inn Swimming Pool renovation, the replacement of the pump house, has been completed and the pool is up and running. Many thanks are due the maintenance staff and the Stafford County Inspection Section for their untiring last minute efforts. The original intent was to repair the old building but when an engineer looked at it and stated it was structurally unsound we were forced to rebuild from the footer up. The plan for the pool is to close Labor Day and start the pool renovation. The new pool and kiddy pool will both be expanded and contain several new features. Plans are available at the Business Office for review.

The Business Office recently came under siege. Several opossums crawled under the building and died. One had the nerve to expire in an air conditioning duct. It turned into quite an effort to get rid of the ensuing odor and the accompanying fleas. Thanks to all who were patient while we operated out of the conference room. It's all behind us but points up the fact that the Business Office like the Harbour Inn Pool is well beyond its useful life.

In order for the lower elevations of the community to have waste water flow, pump stations are required. To keep the pumps operating during power outages Stafford County has or is installing emergency generators. The large yellow generator in the flats on Aquia Drive is just one of those essential generators. Its unsightly installation turned into a shock and resulted in the entire plan being reviewed by the board of directors.

That generator will eventually be relocated, repainted and screened. All future installations will receive similar treatment to blend them into the community.

This summer will again see us doing some major road paving and road pipe replacements. Parking lot restriping will also be undertaken. We will provide advance notice and try to confine work to non peak hours but there still may be some delays. Please plan accordingly. Other major activities planned are the erection of a hay storage pole barn at the stables and some contractual essential repairs at the marina. The Yacht Club lease has been renewed as has the trash contract. Due to consolidations there are not as many competitors as we would like for the trash contract. This appears to be a sign of the times. One major change is that all trash must be in the toter. An additional toter is available from Waste Management. One service we do gain is a large item pickup program. If a patron will call Waste Management at 1-800-969-2069 they will give a pick up price and date.

Steady progress is being made in obtaining a dredging permit. We are chipping away at the lengthy list of requirements provided by the regulatory agencies. Two major issues are rebuilding the spoils site and getting authorization to dredge to the width and depth necessary. Recently an outside contractor had a roof rack load shift and tore off a portion of the Gate Guard Building roof. Many thanks to Mike Shepherd, one of our resident roofers, for quickly and efficiently rebuilding the roof. Police manning is finally back up to authorization but 2 officers are waiting to attend the Police Academy. If you see two officers in a car one is probably in training. We expect to have a full force on the road by year's end.

Several reminders- Bingo is still alive and running. To be a real success it needs more participation. Dates are the first Friday and third Sunday of the month both at the Harbour Inn Community Center. An expanded 4th of July celebration is being firmed up as this is being written. Look for loads of family entertainment from a moon bounce to a dunking tank. Watch for details. The last horse show of the season is September 23rd and it's free.

If you have visitors coming or expect a contractor please call the gate so we can streamline entry for everyone.

Let's talk Trash

We are finalizing the new 3 year trash contract with Waste Management as this is being written. One thing that makes it difficult during this time is that our budget planning begins late in the year and the new budget is finalized by April 1st. The dues and trash rate are set at this time for the coming year which begins July 1st. We can anticipate an increase in trash fees at contract time but can only guess how much it will be when we set the budget.

We solicited bids from every trash contractor in the area capable of handling a community of this size and Waste Management had the lowest price. We negotiated with them to provide access to bulk item pick up which has been a problem for us since they dropped that service in the last contract. They have agreed to provide bulk pick up to our

residents on a cost per item basis. Their exact details are still being worked out but essentially each resident desiring a bulk item pick up will contact Waste Management at 1 800 969-2069 and a date will be determined for the homeowner to set that item at the curb. Waste Management will then bill the homeowner individually depending on the type and size of the item. Some other changes they insist on are as follows:

1. Yard waste must be in **clear plastic bags** and a maximum of **5 bags** each Thursday (they will give us a grace period for the clear bags which are available at Lowes or Home Depot)
2. **They will only take trash that is in their plastic toter** and a maximum of 2 toters. (the blue, maroon or brown toters from ABC are OK) The truck must be able to mechanically dump the toter. An additional toter can be purchased for cost minus \$1. They will replace or repair broken toters free of charge.

Speaking of Waste

Stafford County has 22 sewage pumping stations throughout Aquia Harbour in order to get our waste out to the treatment facility. During a prolonged power outage there is a high risk of sewage backing up into toilets and homes. Many people found that out the hard way after Hurricane Isabel. In order to prevent that situation, the county is installing 14 new generators at critical pumping stations in our community. We have met with the utility dept. and they have agreed to screen these units with evergreen shrubs and even paint them a neutral color in some locations.

The generator that most people can readily see is the one on Aquia Drive near Dewey Drive which is right smack in a homeowner's front yard. That will be going away in the future because the county will be purchasing the empty lot a few lots down (the old basketball court) and they will relocate that generator & pumping station and improve the appearance and function of that station.

Fire & Rescue Changes

A couple of months ago some board members and the General Manager met with the new Fire Chief, Ron Brown, and his assistant regarding placing a fire truck at the Aquia Harbour Rescue Squad building. Once he realized how many people live in the harbour and how long it takes to get out to the end of Section 3, he was willing to consider giving us fire truck coverage. He later met with the rescue squad members and they have

agreed to host a fire truck at the station. The real benefit of this will be that we will now have rescue and fire coverage 24/7 because the fire truck will have county employees who are also trained paramedics.

Bingo

Bingo games at the Harbour Inn have been entertaining residents for a couple of months now and some folks have gone home with a big smile and a pocket full of cash. Stop by and visit sometime soon. They are run on the 1st Friday of the month and the 3rd Sunday each month.

Spring in Aquia Harbour has been great this year; the days have been warm and the nights cool (for the most part) and the rain came just when it seemed like a dry spell was going to stick around. Aquia Harbour is a beautiful place to live and also a beautiful place to work. I truly enjoy being able to drive on every street here and to see everything that residents and staff do to keep things looking great and to make our community such a visual pleasure for everyone.

Spring does seem to bring something else that is not so pleasurable for most residents and certainly not for the police officers charged with providing a safe environment for us all.

SPEEDING. The most common complaint from residents this spring has been a concern about the number of vehicles which are traveling in excess of our posted 25 mph speed limit and about the high speeds that some of these vehicles are reaching. In the Police Department we have also noticed a change and see a greater number of speeders at higher speeds. Another complaint that we receive on a regular basis is that it is becoming more common for some drivers to pass other vehicles on our streets. As we all know there are no streets that are marked to allow passing and there are no areas where it would be safe to pass.

Our enforcement efforts have already increased and will continue to increase until we can see that drivers are complying with the 25 mph speed limit and are respecting the no passing lines in the roads. All of the police units are equipped with radar units and soon our new radar unit with enhanced capabilities will be in service. We will utilize the radar units, special enforcement assignments and visual monitoring to address this issue.

We still need assistance and support from our residents. Discuss the passing and speeding problem with your families and friends. Get the message across about how dangerous speeding can be on our roads that are not designed for high speeds and about the danger when passing in limited visibility areas. There are walkers, joggers, children who sometimes are not attentive, people pulling out of driveways, bicyclists, and others who can end up in the path of a moving vehicle. No one wants to see the tragedy that can result from the careless act of speeding or improper passing in our community.

Hopefully the summer will be a continuation of spring and we will have a great summer also. The temperatures will be hotter but just right for summer and the rain showers and storms will be here when appropriate. I'll still be on the streets as much as possible so flag me down and we'll talk.

AHPS is a non-profit cooperative association whose existence depends solely upon the support of its membership. Parents are responsible for the organization and the administration of the school. This co-op recognizes that the parent is the primary educator of the child and the co-op, in return for the parent's work and commitment, provides the opportunity to share in the child's first academic experience and steps toward independence. Editorials

Who Covets our Covets? (Ben Blankenship)

The outside world calls them cul-de-sacs. But we inside the gate know better, don't we. Here, the Harbour's own dead-end, home-clustered little enclaves are COVES, and none of that French la-de-da, thank you very much.

They range from that tiny little bump on John Paul Jones' butt—Marine Cove with only three homes, in the first section--to that hidden one in the third section--Raft Cove with its hilly road that amounts to a children's playground, attaching to Commodore Cove off Titanic. We have lots of them. Guess how many.

In case you hadn't heard, we even have our very own Crow's Nest. It's called a cove, but I don't know why, other than the fact that the street just comes to a dead-end way out yonder. It looks merely like an extension of Wave Drive in the third section, but it's a lovely hideaway nevertheless, as its neighborly residents would agree.

Some evening when you have idle time, discover these little nooks and crannies of our community.

First, a little of Aquia Harbour's distinctive nomenclature about street addresses: You may consider your home to be on a cove, but it has an address identification of the street to which the cove is attached. That's probably because the post office labels your address according to the road where your driveway accesses. Also, in the street numbering scheme, most homes in the first section have addresses upward from 1000; in the second section upward from 2000 and in the third, 3000 and above. Simple, right?

Not quite. Those cove addresses start with 100 in the first section, 200 in the second and 300 in the third.

Typically, real estate agents say homes on a cul-de-sac command a premium on the market. As a recent piece in the Wall Street Journal noted, "For many families, cul-de-sac living represents the epitome of suburban bliss..." But it seems that many city planners want to limit them or ban them in future developments. They add to traffic problems and their narrow turnarounds can hamper emergency vehicles.

And ours, I might add, are especially hard to find. That may be exactly what some cove residents like most about them.

For sure, ours are thick as fleas. Count 'em:

In the first section there's Pinta, Nina, Columbus, Portugal, Pilgrim, Channel, Jolly Roger, Nautical, Harbour, Richmond, Marine, Chesapeake, and of course, Starboard and Port, at least on some maps. They don't have any homes on them. One runs beside the stables and the vehicle storage lot. The other is actually the road to the Lions pavilion.

Section Two lists Admiral, Wilson, Foresail, Anchor, Bosun, Bulkhead, Lighthouse, Beacon, Crow's Nest, Fathom, Midshipman, Gulf, Bay, Commander, Manila, Gull, Stern, Bow, Mast, and Monitor.

Section Three's coves: Voyage, Clippership, Cutter, Commodore, Raft, Ironside, Sail, Whaler, Destroyer and Battleship.

Check 'em out, matey. I may have missed yours.

Coves are mostly but not totally unique to here. For example, in Valley Ridge, north of Widewater Elementary, there's Captain Cove and Swansea Cove. And in Hampton Oaks there's Jamall, Matio, and Newland.

Too bad theirs don't have the safeguards ours do.
