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**General Manager  
Review**

At this writing the new budget is just waiting final review and approval so details and comments will be held for just a little longer. We expect to again close out this year very close to on target - probably slightly to the positive side. One thing of note is that every effort is going to be made to make the marina more accommodating to the entire community. The invitations to bid on the dredging and E & F Dock removal are on the street and due back as this goes to print. The plan is to have a recommended contractor for the April board meeting and to have work underway in late July or August. We are still working with the developer of the Hills at Aquia on some innovative ways to obtain some financial support. The issue of Stafford County support is still unresolved. With the loss of the E & F Docks slip availability is going to be slim. If you haven't returned a slip contract it may be too late. The new gazebo for the marina is on hand and just waiting for the concrete slab to be poured and cured. It's tied in with the new shelter house for Briar Patch Park. Both pads will be poured at the same time to save money. The Briar Patch Shelter House is just awaiting approval of the plans by Stafford County. That should happen any day so we can expect completion in time for the summer season.

T-Mobile is well underway with the construction of the two mobile phone towers off Harpoon Drive and Channel Cove. We expect them to be operational very soon with the accompanying income stream. Recently Dominion Virginia Power has been surveying to lay out a plan for possibly burying the new controversial power line. This is good news but like all good things comes with a price- higher utility bills. If the line is buried they will need an above ground terminal station for tie in. The potential site they identified was on our spoils site off Channel Cove. I explained that was unworkable and we are now reviewing other near-by sites. Work has slowed significantly at the Town Center. I more than suspect with the down turn in the economy future building will be dependent on having tenants with signed leases. The build out may be a lot longer than we want or expect. We have worked with the motel owner and recently installed large pipes at the corner of the access road from Washington Drive to prohibit large trucks from entering and destroying the landscaping.

Delinquencies and foreclosures seem to be a sign of the times. If you don't pay your association dues we will follow the collection policy of notifications and attorney involvement. This can be very expensive and only make a bad situation worse. Please don't let this happen. If you are having a problem we stand by to work with you on a payment plan.

Recently we have had several cases of door to door solicitation. This is against association documents and should be immediately reported to the Business Office or Police. We also are occasionally experiencing cases of residents vouching in visitors who then impose on or solicit other residents. Remember if you vouch in a visitor you are responsible for their actions be it a friend, relative or contractor. Your inviting them in does not mean free rein of the community.

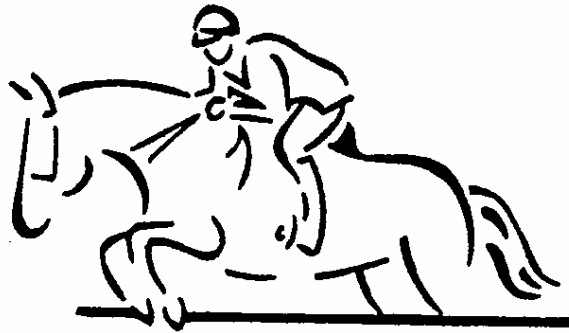

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## Aquia Harbour Rescue

On March 8<sup>th</sup> I had to opportunity to attend a conference on brain injuries sponsored by the Brain Injury Association of Virginia. Information in this article is from materials and classes at the conference. “Brain Injury: More than just a Bump on the Head?” Problems resulting from a brain injury can be physical, cognitive or emotional. Some symptoms are immediate but others may not show up until much later. Symptoms requiring medical attention include: persistent headache, confusion, neck pain, slowness in thinking, acting, speaking, or reading, short term memory loss, trouble paying attention, concentrating, making decisions, solving problems, fatigue, loss of balance, blurred vision, and ringing in the ears. If you experience any of these symptoms following a “bump” on the head, let a doctor know. This is especially important in the elderly, where cases have shown shrinkage as the brain ages, so that there is more room in the skull for movement, i.e. injury.

With the warmer weather approaching more bikes will be on the road. All riders should wear a helmet to protect their heads. Teach your children the “Rules of the Road.” Maintain your bikes in good working condition. Are the brakes working? Do you have reflective tape or a light for riding at dusk or night?

The Aquia Harbour Volunteer Rescue Squad was awarded a grant by the Department of Health, Division of Unintentional Injury Prevention to purchase bike helmets for low income children. The program includes bike safety education with the helmet distribution. The Squad plans on sponsoring the event in May inconjunction with Emergency Medical Services Week.

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## Editorials

### County Elections: Costly for Us?

Regular as clockwork, here comes income tax time, the bane of our existence.

Earlier during my working career I kept doing all my returns myself, even without those computer programs like Quicken that came along in later years. I figured that since IRS sends out those instructions on how to do the returns, they were meant for me to follow, and so I interpreted them as best, for me, as I could.

It worked, but only after a lot of annual hair pulling and chin scratching over those complicated K-1's, schedule D's and such. Fact is, soon after the schedule D forms were made so impossibly difficult some years ago, I gave up. Much to my wife's relief, I handed the task over to a local CPA, and then to another one, Charles Darrow, who has turned out to charge much less and do just as good a job.

One downside of living in Aquia Harbour is that we can't deduct homeowner association dues, which are now well north of \$1,000 a year. Not that they're unique, and I expect we get more than most residents affected elsewhere similarly for the dues we pay. Still, they are a pain.

Most likely they are rising again this year, although this being written before March 15, it's hazardous to guess by how much. Besides, beware, for my prediction skills must have been brought into severe question recently, when contrary to my published expectations, the county's reassessed valuations on our residences fell quite much, about 15 percent in my case.

Not that this reduction will mean our real estate tax bill will soften. The county is in a budget crunch, so our tax rates are likely to soar. You'll probably know by how much by the time this gets into print.

Considering the non-deductibility of our dues, I've had--surprise!-- a novel thought. What if, instead of our AHPOA having to pay for most of the necessary creek dredging coming up due to the siltation partly caused by the new Hills at Aquia, why not convince the county to pay a goodly share of it, along with the developer? Then, whatever increase in county taxes transpires will later be deductible. And our AHPOA dues will increase only moderately, as usual.

There's a slight problem with that idea. County supervisors aren't exactly thrilled at having to pony up part of the dredging expenses, as had earlier been anticipated. Aquia's Paul Milde is totally in our corner, but I hear that Bob Woodson, an Aquia Harbour resident and the recently elected supervisor for Griffis-Widewater, is cool on the idea to say the least. You will recall he beat long-time incumbent Jack Cavalier, who had supported us. Our votes, alas, are consequential.

Thus, all you denizens of sections 2 and 3 who helped elect Woodson, get on his case. You may be able to realize more of a deductible county tax expenditure as a result and a lesser rise in your nondeductible AHPOA dues.

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**Summary of the Unofficial Minutes  
of the AHPOA Board of Directors  
February regular meeting – February 28, 2008**

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- Open Thirty. Topics included the bylaws, state laws and the golf course's ninth hole.
- Directors Comments. Responses were made to some Open Thirty comments. The Lions Club will be holding a White Cane fundraiser.
- Amenity Manager. There was no report.
- Committee Reports. Discussed in New Business.
  
- Treasurer's Report. An overview of the association's finances was given.
- General Manager's Report.
  - Dredging. Four vendors had been asked to bid on the project.
  - Shelter House. Building permits were being obtained for the Briarpatch shelter. Site work was underway for a gazebo at the marina and another at the Country Club pool.
  - Aquia Town Centre. A copy of the easement agreement had been sent to Ramco-Gershenson. Vertical pipes were being installed at the corner of the Washington Drive entrance to prevent large trucks from damaging the curb.
  - High Voltage Line. Virginia Power was investigating the cost and feasibility of burying a high voltage line. Surveying was to begin soon.
  - Virginia Power Site Request. Virginia Power had submitted a request to purchase some land for a terminal station. The land is part of the association's spoils site.
  - Navigational Aids in Aquia Creek. Repairs and replacements were to be made in the spring.
  - Auditor. It was agreed to continue with Goldklang, Cavanaugh and Associates as the association's auditors.
  - Electronic Payment of Dues and Fees. Additional research was needed on to how to facilitate the payment of dues and fees by credit card or electronically.
  - Delinquency Notices. It was agreed to resume sending reminders to residents who are one quarter past due.
  - Police Chief Position. Candidates were being interviewed.
- Old Business.
  - Slip Fees and Golf Fees. The FY09 fees were approved.
  - Collection Policy. The procedures were to be reviewed and possible ways to reduce costs explored.
  - Government Island Transfer. It was agreed to defer signing the final document until after the directors had reviewed the paperwork.
  - Proposed Water Line Tie-In. The county was to be asked to send a copy of the proposed agreement for a tie-in on Aquia Drive.
- New Business.
  - Hay Barn Lights. The Stable Committee proposed installing lights in the hay barn. Research was needed regarding insurance, county code etc.

Pool. Extra money had been factored in the budget for an adult pool manager. Money needed to be included for extra lifeguard coverage at the Harbour Inn pool.

FY09 Budget. It was agreed to schedule a special session to discuss the budget.

Golf Tournament Request. The green fees were waived for a fundraising tournament.

Committee Appointments. Appointments were made to the bylaws, legal compliance and public safety committees.

Board Policy. Directors were reminded that the board takes action as a body.

Letter to Widewater Supervisor. It was agreed to discuss this further in executive session.

After coming out of executive session, the board approved submitted payment plan requests and rejected three separate requests for a waiver of the initiation fee.
