**Are you ready for Winter?" It's coming either way!**

**There is no way to stop the snow from coming – I've tried! There are however, a few things you can do to be in the best position to be safe when it comes;**

- ❖ Trim overgrown branches back from the house and electrical wires to prevent iced-over or wind-swept branches from causing property damage or a power problem.
- ❖ Shut off exterior faucets. Drain water from outdoor pipes, valves, and sprinkler heads to protect against pipe bursts.

- ❖ Inspect outdoor lighting around the property. Good illumination will help minimize the chance of accidents on icy walkways at night.
- ❖ Make sure you have an ample supply of ice melt or sand on hand for steps, walkways, and the driveway.
- ❖ Stock your car with the following for the season; a blanket, jumper cables, flashlight, chains, first aid kit, a small knife, flares, energy bars, gloves, a small shovel, waterproof matches, ice scraper, bag of kitty litter, phone charger. Stranded by the side of the road can be dangerous in the best of conditions, but when sub-zero temperatures or bad weather is involved, it can be downright deadly. Carrying these supplies may save your life:
- ❖ Sign up for the Chief's Twitter notifications (AHPDChief) to get road condition updates on your cell phone and send your email to [ChiefharmanAHPD@aol.com](mailto:ChiefharmanAHPD@aol.com) to get email notifications.
- ❖ Please stay home when you can during snow storms. Last year I asked you to stay put – you did and man what a difference in road conditions! The roads could be cleared before they were packed down and they melted so much faster.
- ❖ Keep Coves clear of vehicles – if the plows cant turn around, you may not get plowed. My officers spend hours slipping down icy driveways asking residents to move their cars.
- ❖ Don't let your new drivers out in ice and snow conditions no matter how much they beg.
- ❖ Help out elderly neighbors or single parents with snow removal.

I have been asked to remind you that littering of any kind is prohibited in the Harbour – including cigarette butts! Yup – you can be charged for throwing a cigarette butt out of the window so please don't do it.

### **Aquia Evening Lions Celebrate Christmas!**

“Santa Claus is coming to town. He’s making a list and checking it twice; he’s gonna find out who’s naughty or nice. Santa Claus is coming to town.” so the Christmas jingle goes. This song replays in the heads of every

member of the Aquia Evening Lions Club a month or two before Thanksgiving. While we're giving thanks for our many blessings, our heads are stirring with thoughts of selling poinsettias, buying and wrapping gifts, arranging Santa visits, and serving our Special Needs adults, all of which require making lists and checking them more than twice to make sure that no one is forgotten in the Christmas rush.

On December 3, we hosted a Breakfast with Santa at the Country Club for 123 Aquia Harbour children and their parents with a full-course breakfast and an opportunity to meet Santa. The Lions arrived early to set up the tables with brown butcher paper, a box of crayons, and a Christmas tree centerpiece. Before and after the children ate, they colored to their heart's content on the paper tablecloth. Some of the artwork was quite creative and almost marketable. Outside the breakfast room, Santa's Workshop was abuzz with activity as children shopped for small gifts for their families; many items were priced between 10 cents and \$1.00 to help teach the little ones a lesson about giving. Mrs. Claus arrived a little early and read "Twas the Night Before Christmas" to the children as they sat at her feet. The Lion King shyly made his rounds among the tables engaging the children by pantomiming silent gestures; some were delighted and others were terrified. The cheerful sound of reindeer bells preceded the arrival of Santa's jolly "Ho, Ho, Ho, Merry Christmas!" The children quickly lined up to wait their chance to speak with Santa as he patiently heard each child's list and smiled for ubiquitous photos and videotaping.

The Monday after Thanksgiving, several Aquia Evening Lions pushed carts through WalMart while shopping from the wish lists of adult clients at several group homes in the Stafford area. Then on Sunday afternoon before the party, all those gifts were wrapped. On December 5, we assisted the Aquia Harbour Host Lions with their Special Needs Christmas party at the Harbour Inn. There were 70 adult guests along with 20 counselors. Both the Aquia Host and Evening Lions and 10 Leos arrived early to set up tables and chairs, the gift table, and the Christmas music for this very special night. The Leos welcomed our guests, delivered meals and lemonade to the tables, distributed Polaroid photos with Santa, and helped clean up afterwards. All participants merrily witnessed the true meaning of Christmas. When Santa arrived, the excitement of the Special Needs adults was like electricity coursing through the room, and the joy on their faces and the exclamations of glee were worth more than any Christmas gift we've ever received. They are always delighted to welcome Santa, to receive their gift, and to take a photo with Santa. One Lion stated, "It was a joy for us to watch the guests open the gifts that we had taken so much time to locate. When we saw them get jewelry or a cowboy hat or whatever they had asked for, we felt privileged to have had the opportunity to serve this special group."

Earlier that same evening, Santa was busy making visits to good little children in the Harbour as he would do this entire week. Santa and Mrs. Claus have parked the sleigh and reindeer at the stables and have hitched a ride in a white pickup truck. They have a list of addresses and the names of children, and Santa's sack is full of gifts for each child they visit. The children timidly come to the door when they hear Santa's iconic "Ho Ho Ho" and the extra reindeer bells that Santa carries with him. Santa and Mrs. Claus were invited inside by the Christmas tree, and Santa spoke with each child before reaching into his sack to draw out a special gift for the child. Most of them tear open the package and are very glad to receive something that was on their wish list. Santa arrived at one house when the children were getting ready for bed, but that did not deter the children from spending time with Santa and happily opening their gifts, and then getting right to the task at hand, playing with their newly-acquired Lego blocks and Angry Birds. They even engaged Santa in a game of catch with the birds. Anyone who has ever served as Mrs. Claus knows every home and every child is different, and it's sheer joy to observe the children who believe. Santa asked one six year old child, "What is the most important thing to remember about Christmas?" Much to Santa's surprise, the child instantly responded, "It's the day that we celebrate the birth of Jesus." This child has his priorities straight!

On December 10, we hosted a Breakfast with Santa for Head Start at the Gayle Middle School in Fredericksburg. The early arrival of the Lions was repeated again as we decorated tables, set up a Christmas

tree, placed the gifts on bleachers, decorated tables, set up the stuffed animal give-away table, arranged craft tables, and greeted our guests. The families enjoyed a full-course breakfast. When Santa arrived with three of his elves, some of the children were mesmerized, some were so excited they couldn't sit still, and some were terrified and hid behind parents as this jolly, old man in a red and white suit greeted every table and child personally. We are very fortunate to share Santa with Santa America, an organization that promotes joy, love, and hope for children and their families in long-term pediatric care, hospice, or bereavement. Santa sat down in his big black chair and regaled the children with two stories about happenings at the North Pole. The first had to do with a new sleigh the elves had built--not too well it seems because, unfortunately, it crashed on its test drive! Not to worry, though, the new sleigh will be ready by Christmas eve! The second had to do with Madison, the Christmas mouse, who helps Santa keep tabs on good little girls and boys. He allowed each child to pet Madison, and then Santa put him in the cuff of his hat so he could keep warm. He then handed out gifts to every child, first the children with red stickers, then the blue stickers and, finally, the green stickers. While one group met with Santa, the others participated in making Christmas ornaments and learning the art of bell ringing from Santa's Elf Coordinator, Elf Noel. As the event ended, each child was able to choose a stuffed animal to take home.

The Lions would like to thank Lion and Chef George White who has kindly prepared the food for the breakfasts with Santa and the Special Needs dinner for many years. George, you're the greatest!

On December 13, several of the Aquia Evening Lions prepared a Christmas luncheon with all the trimmings for the Aquia Harbour Police. We feel privileged to live in a safe community, and this is one way we can thank these dedicated professionals for their services. Thank you, Aquia Harbour Police and Chief Harman.

Many members of the Aquia Evening Lions and the Aquia Harbour Host Lions are involved in coordinating and staffing all of these special Christmas events. While they have visions of lists, lists, and more lists weeks before the events are held, the visions of sugar plums dancing in their heads sweetly replace the lists after the last Lions Christmas event is held. We could not host an event without the help of our devoted memberships. We are so grateful for the dedication and hard work of all of our Lions. Well done, Lions and Leos!
