Review**

**General Manager Review – (Chuck Halt) 659-3050**

Within the next few weeks we should be doing our CY06 road paving. The primary areas will be: Aquia Drive from Richmond Drive to the bridge, Admiral Drive from Harpoon Drive to 2015 Wave Drive, the bottom of Coast Guard Dive, Aquia Drive –the 2200 block and 2165 to 2002, several intersections and overlaying the Country Club parking lot. Additionally, a 5' walking/biking path will be installed along Aquia Drive from Farragut Drive to the top of the hill on Aquia Drive. Paving will be followed by pavement striping as soon as it can be scheduled. Watch for additional details. Your cooperation in making this another safe operation will be appreciated.

Renovation of the Harbour Inn Swimming Pool is scheduled to start immediately after the Labor Day closure. Details have been provided earlier and design drawings are available in the Business Office. The major improvements being bubblers, several water features, a zero entry, a larger kiddy pool and two shade structures. The new hay barn should be going up any day. We are just waiting for a Stafford County building permit. We recently received another Boating Infrastructure Grant. This one is to replace our aging pump out station at the marina. The grant is the result of hard work by Shawn Desmond and will cover 75% of the cost. Shawn is currently working to get us an additional grant to assist with dredging costs. The dredging permit itself has been returned for further details and is scheduled to be back with the governmental agencies by October 4<sup>th</sup> (84 additional sheets of detailed drawings are now being requested).

In an effort to save the road into Lions Park from the ravages of Austin Run, I have put together a package for the Army Corp of Engineers to approve a bank stabilization project. I expect this to be approved very soon and plan on using some of the concrete slabs from the renovation of the Harbour Inn Pool deck.

Several issues that need a constant reminder: The ditches in front of nearly all the homes belong to the association as common property. However, the maintenance of them and any approved parking pads are a homeowner responsibility. Please keep them neat, cut and tidy. Do not use weed killer as it leads to erosion and absolutely do not rake the leaves into them. This only clogs the pipes which endangers the road and potentially could flood your neighbor. Remember that the trash contract is for residential trash and all trash must be in the tote to be picked up. An additional tote is available by request. If you have large items or more than a few bags of leaves they are your responsibility. Waste Management will, for a fee, remove them by arrangement (1-800-969-2069). The landfill on Eskimo Road is available for all county residents with a decal on their vehicle.

When you sell or dispose of a vehicle please remove the decal. More than one less than desirable individual has been able to gain unrestricted access to the community because someone forgot or neglected to remove the decal. Again,

if you are expecting guests or workmen, please call the gate (659-7224). This will avoid your guest being delayed while we call you and will speed things up for all.

Remember school is back in session and kids and buses are about. Caution is the word.

OK, I said it was hot and supposed to be hot but not as hot as it has been the past few weeks. Please don't blame me. I assure you I did not wish the 100 degree days on us. Anyway, I have spoken with my local weather guru and she says we shouldn't worry because the long range forecast is that we will have winter this year as in the past.

This month brought us something that we haven't seen in a long while and always seems to be so senseless when it does happen. Pilgrim Cove residents experienced a vandalism spree that involved the puncturing of vehicle tires by one or more individuals. The final count was seven vehicles vandalized with a total of twenty tires stabbed. In Stafford County, outside of Aquia Harbour, I am told the count was 50 to nearly 70 vehicles vandalized in the same way during the same time period. I wish I could say that we know who is responsible for this damage but at the present time we have not developed any firm suspects. As always, please give us a call if you see something or someone out of place or when things just don't seem right.

As many of you have noticed and some have commented on, the Roads & Grounds personnel have been preparing sections of our roads for the annual paving that is necessary to maintain our pot hole free driving. In some places it is necessary to remove sections of deteriorated paving and to fill those sections with gravel so the paving can take place later this year. Please be extra careful around these gravel sections. Steering and brakes are less effective and gravel can be thrown into other vehicles and pedestrians. Lowering the speed of your vehicle in these areas can help keep everyone safe.

School will be starting soon. I was talking with a college student a few days ago who said he missed high school because his brother in high school gets three more weeks of vacation after he goes back to college. Be aware of the busses and students that will again be everywhere and make this a good "going back to school" time.

Take care, be safe, and remember that winter will be here on schedule.

**AHPOA Regular June Meeting  
June 22, 2006**

First order of business was to conduct the Prize Giveaway. Winners were randomly selected from those who registered on the Aquia Harbour website for the newsletter email delivery service.

**"Open Thirty":**

**Jim Hodges – Golf Course Issues:**

Mr. Hodges thanked the Board for looking into the AH golf course accounting principles with regard to handling money taken in at golf tournaments. He looks forward to the Board's continued effort.

**Fred Thomas, Lot 1939 – re: covenants, etc.**

Mr. Thomas expressed displeasure that his by-law proposals were not given proper consideration in his opinion.

**Parks and Waterways Committee, re: baseball fields**

The committee has concerns about the condition of the baseball fields are in after the adult softball games. She stated they are not cleaning up the field after use and brought the in the trash she had recently collected (bottle caps, cigarette butts, broken glass...). The committee was also displeased that the anchors which allow the bases to be moved for softball vs. baseball play, were not being replaced when the bases are moved. Many of the anchors are now missing. She said she has made several requests to the organizers to clean up the field and replace the anchors after use, but has not seen any response.

The General Manager stated a letter was sent to the organizers last year about these issues and the need to follow the rules outlining the use of the fields. The business office stated they will send out another letter and if the rules are not followed, these teams will no longer be allowed to use the baseball/softball fields.

**Jim Smizer, Dog Park Committee Chairman**

The committee has looked at several sites within Aquia Harbour and the preferred site is an area adjacent to Lions Park. He said the Committee will create a proposal to present to the Board at next month's meeting.

**Directors' Comments:**

Director Cruea said the outdoor movie night was a success even though a sudden rainstorm forced the moviegoers inside the Country Club to continue the films.

Director Reinboldt expressed concern over whether official policy was set or simply discussed with regard to shed structures on a resident's property. The BOD agreed to discuss these issues with the Architecture Control Committee to help set guidelines.

**Minute and Action Items:**

Minutes from the previous AHPOA meeting were accepted as presented.

**Amenities' Managers Reports:**

Golf Course – Residents played 150 rounds of golf last week, which is up from a year ago. The redesign of green #9 is on hold while they await contractor bids. \$25,000 had been set aside in this year's budget for the renovation, but the projected cost is now \$38,000. The Board voted to carry over the funds into next year's budget.

**Shawn Desmond – AH Marina Committee**

1. Discovery Days Festival – August 19-20, 2006. Stafford County Department of Tourism has spent thousands of dollars to advertise and support the Flotilla, which is sponsored by the Aquia Harbour Marina. ### **General Manager's Report:**

The full report can be obtained in the Business Office. The following issues were addressed or added to the original report.

1. The Dolphin Swim Team recently requested that the Harbour Inn pool design be changed to increase the depth in the main section. This is due to a change in competition rules requiring a specific depth for diving starts. A resident, Jim Smith, expressed concern about the cost of designing the pool and didn't want dues used to pay for changes. Director Reinboldt and the General Manager said they were looking into the cost of redesigning the pool, but no changes have been made. At the present time, the original plan will continue, unchanged and without delay.
2. The Board voted to accept Virginia Paving's proposal for the CY 2006 road paving.
3. The Board approved the conditions of the grant that Shawn Desmond obtained to replace the pump out station for the marina.
4. The General Manager put in a request to the Army Core of Engineers to stabilize the bank along the creek in Lions Park.

### **New Business:**

1. The Board voted to dedicate the Gate House in Bill Carpenter's memory. The General Manager will look into the cost to create a memorial plaque.
2. The location of the BOD Annual Meeting has been changed to the Country Club on October 21 at 1030 am -1200 pm.

In honor of Jamestown's approaching 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2007, Aquia Harbour Marina in conjunction with the Stafford County Department of Tourism sponsored the Jamestown's replica of the historic tall sailing ship the Godspeed to Aquia Creek as part of Discovery Days at Aquia Landing. The Discovery Days Flotilla (boat parade) rendezvous with the Godspeed at the mouth of Aquia Creek and sailed out into the Potomac River where it fired its cannons while various fireboats sprayed their water cannons for viewers on shore. Aquia Harbour received statewide recognition for their part in the event. Many of the participants in the Flotilla traveled from all across the state. **Outage? No, it's a power FAILURE**

Another storm hits, another tree falls across a power line. And once again we light up the candles and sweat and swear.

Why can't the electric company put all the lines underground and avoid the hassle?

Well, it seems there are lines and then there are lines. You can understand the problem of distinguishing which is which by remembering the last time your lights went kaput. Even then, you may recall, your hard-wired telephone (but not your cordless, which relies on an electric plug) most likely kept working.

That's because the telephone wire comes in over the (surprise!) telephone pole. So does the electricity line, but separately. The electricity on the pole comes via Dominion's big power transmission line that is stepped down by a substation or something before it gets to the distribution line and then via a telephone pole to your abode.

Now, here's what I'm getting to: They say the telephone wire is strung below the electric line. So when a storm knocks a tree down hereabouts and your power sources are in the way, the tree usually knocks out the top ones and might spare the telephone line below. Simple? Not at all. It's much more complicated than that, but it's adequate for explaining to the wife and kids.

(Speaking of whom, please spare me in my comfortable dementia any sermons about political correctness. "Outages," indeed. Thank you.)

That's how we get the power and the non-cell phone service here, unlike in some of the newer subdivisions where the lines to residences are underground.

So they are less likely to suffer an electric power failure than we are, regardless of our gate guards and Chuck Halt. But our quaint telephone poles aren't the only reason.

Stafford's older communities, you may have noticed, have big trees, unlike the newest ones that are bereft of them, thanks to uncaring bulldozers and (naturally) greedy developers. Speaking of whom, they should be thanked for having the electric distribution lines buried before being condemned for leaving their residents treeless.

And sometimes I get kinda dizzy...

As I noted previously in a column about the new power line issue, Dominion Power can get ugly on the subject of burying its major power lines. Doing so would cost a ton, and besides, lest you forget, Dominion is a monopoly provider, so we'd be the ones to pay. You and I will be dead and gone, hopefully not from a power failure, long before those towers and high lines come down.

Meanwhile, relax and enjoy our fine shady lanes and neighborhoods rapidly maturing into vintage Americana--along with quaint smelly candles, just in case.
